I Was Blind, but Now I See

John 8:12 (NKJV) Then Jesus spoke to them again, saying, "I am the light of the world. He who follows Me shall not walk in darkness, but have the light of life."

"Who Sinned?" John 9:1–5

What did the disciples see when they saw the blind man?

What did Jesus see?

Is suffering caused by a specific sin?

How can a man sin before he is born?

We may suffer early consequences of our deliberate sins.

But, not everything that happens is because of a sin.

Greatest suffers are not to be looked upon as the greatest sinner.

Thus, it's possible to see and yet be blind to what is going on around us.

The Witness' Own Testimony. John 9:6-12

After applying the dirt with His spit Jesus sends him to the pool of Siloam.

Notice: Jesus never told the blind man that He was going to heal him.

What's it like to have never seen anything and now seeing everything.

The Neighbor's question, "How were your eyes opened?"

Spiritual Blindness John 9:13-34

They brought him to the Pharisees... Why?!

John helps us understand vs 14. Sabbath day.

The 'criminal' acts. Jesus broke 3 of their rules.

Blinded by Facts? (John 9:15ff)

Did a miracle really occur? Call in the parents.

The former blind man's story does not change... but he does get bolder.

'Showing' the Pharisees the truth... (vss 30-33)

What does it mean to be spiritually blind? (John 9:35-41)

After finding him, Jesus asked him "Do you believe in the Son of God?"

Jesus summed up who was blind, who could see. (vs 39)

"There are none so blind than those who will not see."

When one asked, "Are we blind also?"

Conclusions & Consequences

Describe the colors of a sunset to a blind person.

Illuminate on red, yellow, purple, orange.

There are more than one kind of blindness.

We all have blind-spots; areas we don't see ourselves as others, or as we really are.

Fix Your Eyes – Focus on Jesus

INTRODUCTION:

- A. Hebrews 11 – “The Golden Chapter of Faith,”
“The eXtreme Faith League Hall of Fame”
1. Look at how many times the sense of sight is referenced (vv. 1, 3, 5, 6, 7, 10, 13, 14, 23, 26, 27)
 2. We may not see God, but we “see” God through the evidence that He presents (Romans 1.20; 8.24-25)
- B. vv. 39, 40 - “...apart from us they would not be made perfect.”
1. You have an important role to play in this race! (1 Corinthians 9.24; 2 Timothy 4.7; Hebrews 12.1)
 2. “[And] THEREFORE...” - Emphatic Conclusion
- C. What is our role in this race?

DISCUSSION:

I. THE FOCUS of the WITNESSES (Hebrews 12.1a)

- A. The Possibilities (11.1-7)
1. The Creator
 2. Trusting Him
 - a. Pleasing God to overcome death
 - b. Seeking God to receive the reward

1. “...welcoming them from a distance...”
 2. Seeking a country of their own.

Do You Want to See?

(Luke 18:35-43 - Matthew 20:29-34)

Introduction: 1. Every day we are bombarded with questions. Some questions are asked to us directly, some are implied, but everyday we answer hundreds of questions. Some are more important than others. Some questions that require an answer from us have little effect on us, and on our lives. Some however, are very important, and how we answer those questions will impact our lives greatly! Answering these hundreds of “daily” questions take time. The questions we feel are unimportant, can be answered quickly. Some, the more important questions will take more time to answer, we like to think about it we like to go through it in our minds - we do that because we know how important the answer is to that question. So we think about it and ponder it.

2. We need to spend time answering those important questions because of how much they affect us, and while we need to put our minds to the questions, and know the importance of some questions, we still need to answer them - we cannot leave the important questions unanswered because we are afraid of the answer - we need to answer the question and then take the action that the answer leads us to. Important questions must be answered, because they are important, and usually the quicker we can come to the conclusion and start taking action to those questions the better off we are.

3. There are some questions, big questions, life altering questions, that we know how to answer and can answer them quickly, because the answer is obvious. We long to answer them, and even though they may be big questions we know the answer right away. This is where desire comes into play. We can answer those questions quickly, even though they are weighty questions, we can answer them because we KNOW what we want. The answer is obvious, and we desire to have the answer

come to reality. In fact the answer is so obvious the questions seems to be a bit silly to even ask.

4. It seems that Jesus is asking one of those questions here. He comes up to a blind man, or a couple of them, how many is not really important, the important thing is the question, and why Jesus asked this question.

We need to ask ourselves questions, and answer some of those questions - and then we will have decided what we are going to do in light of the answers that we give to questions. And some of the answers are obvious, but we still drag our feet in answering them and taking action. Jesus here will ask a question and the answer is obvious, — or so it seems.

I. What is desire

- Websters will define desire like this: “To long for, or hope for.” In his 1828 dictionary Webster will give a more detailed definition, “An emotion, or excitement of the mind directed to the attainment or possession of an object from with pleasure, sensual, intellectual or spiritual is expected.”
- Why do we have desire; why do we WANT for something/anything?

II. What we do when desire meets up with opportunity

- When desire meets opportunity we thrown into a crossroads - decisions must be made.

III. What is Jesus really teaching here?

- This is the most important question that can ever be put to us, and while the answer is so obvious from a physical standpoint it is just as obvious from a spiritual one.
- This is not about physical eyesight it is about spiritual eyesight
- This is not about physical healing is it about spiritual healing

VI. What does healing bring?

- Salvation - home in heaven
- The healing of sight that Jesus brings, takes us to a life with a spiritual focus - takes us to spiritual growth - allows us to SEE what this life is truly all about!

Conclusion:

1. What to do when desire meets with opportunity
2. Jesus has given us the opportunity
3. Now the decision is on us - and the real question that we must ask is: Do we want to SEE?!
4. Jesus gives us opportunity to see - and to continue to see.

“Sight for the Blind”

“He has sent me to proclaim freedom for the prisoner and recovery of sight for the blind, to set the oppressed free,...” Luke 4:14

A--Blindness has a way of bringing on desperation.

1. There's something about a desperate moment that gives us an opportunity to see things when otherwise we're not really interested.
2. There's something about desperation that causes us to be open.
3. Humble desperation is what invites the power of God to be demonstrated in our lives

B—Gods plan verses reality

1. We were created in the image of God.
Genesis 1:27
2. The garden of Eden was a picture of perfection. **Genesis 2:9**
3. No blindness, no desperation
4. In a moment sin changes God's plan for mankind. **Genesis 3:6**
5. God provides our only hope. **Isaiah 40:31**

C—2 Kings 5 Story of Naaman—degrees of
blindness and desperation

1. The first level-Realization that a challenge lies ahead. **V.1**
2. The second level-Openness to the Godly counsel of other people. **V.2**
3. The third level-Willingness to ask for help from others. **Vs.9-11**
4. The fourth level—Readiness to obey God **V.14**

God is calling us out of our blindness and desperation and into His mission. His Spirit and His Life live inside of each of us. We have been reconciled to God through the power of reconciliation. He has cured our spiritual blindness and has the power to take away our desperation!

Lord, Open My Eyes—Don't Lose Your Focus

Proverbs 4:20-27—“My son, pay attention to what I say; turn your ear to my words. 21 Do not let them out of your sight, keep them within your heart; 22 for they are life to those who find them and health to one's whole body. 23 Above all else, guard your heart, for everything you do flows from it. 24 Keep your mouth free of perversity; keep corrupt talk far from your lips. 25 Let your eyes look straight ahead; fix your gaze directly before you. 26 Give careful thought to the[c] paths for your feet and be steadfast in all your ways. 27 Do not turn to the right or the left; keep your foot from evil.”
